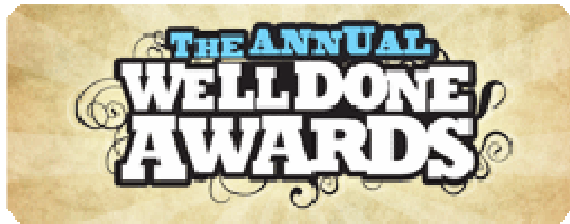




Kingdom Assignment 2009 Well Done Awards

Delivering hope and a future in Southern Sudan

Upon hearing the statistics that one in nine women and one in four newborns die in childbirth in Southern Sudan I was deeply shocked and saddened. I knew that something had to be done to change this, so **KAS teamed up with the Birthing Kit Foundation of Australia** and many KAS supporters, to raise money through selling cards costing just \$5. Supplying these kits, which allow a safe and sterile delivery, can potentially save five mothers and babies' lives.



In January 2009 I took the first 200 kits over. I had the privilege of meeting and training the traditional birth attendants and visiting a mother who had given birth only hours before I arrived. In her little mud dung hut lying on the floor was a tiny little baby boy. He was gorgeous. This baby was safe and healthy, thank God!

The traditional birthing attendants told me how this is the rare scenario; that the simplest items like soap, cord ties and even a sharp edge to cut the umbilical cord were next to impossible to get, due to the remoteness of the Malony community. It's a three day trip by foot to get to the nearest clinic and about a six hour drive. I saw first hand the difference that these kits will make and that they will truly save lives.

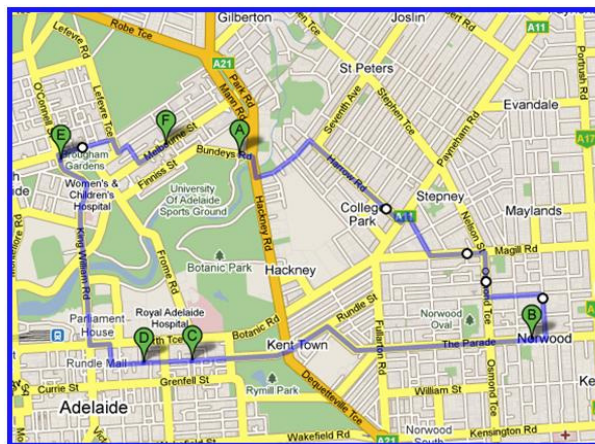
The S.O.S. (Saving of Sudan) 10km Walkathon Sunday September 13th 2:00pm onwards
