### Letter from Anthony Jaeschke .....

My wife and I watched the KAS DVD and were inspired to help however we could. We immediately knew that this was a cause that we wanted to apply ourselves to, raising both awareness of the Sudanese's plight and the much needed funds.

I often ride my mountain bike long distances and pondered how to make this into a fundraiser that the community could get behind. My wife was flowing with ideas; all I had to do was ride the 85kms and perhaps recruit some volunteers to pedal with me.

Where do I start with how many doors God opened for us? We ended up with a dozen businesses sponsoring us, a local pub (for lunch at the halfway mark), the newspaper, and local businesses for advertising.

Two men from church enthusiastically put their hands up for the challenge and I was proud that my daughter and her friend (only 10 and 11 yrs old) also pedaled 36kms! God blessed the entire day, from the weather, to the luncheon and the wonderful time of fellowship.

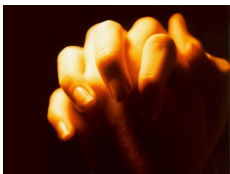


### *In Deed and Truth update...*

With the date of independence only a month away, fighting has broken out in Abeyi and cattle raiding is becoming more and more frequent. Fuel is just about impossible to get and if you can get it, it is about \$20 a gallon which is extremely expensive. Sabet and Suzy from In Deed and Truth have spent the last month in Kenya trying to get food, fuel and medicine for their ministry. The wet season has struck with force knocking out their phones, internet and solar power for three weeks so communication with them over this period has been impossible.

Due to the above factors Abraham (the builder building the school building) has been stranded in Tonj and unable to return to Malony at this stage. It is unknown at this stage exactly when he will be able to return and continue the building project.
